AP Scholar Awards

Fourteen students at Fort Bend Baptist Academy in Sugar Land have earned AP Scholar Awards in recognition of their exceptional achievement on AP Exams.

The College Board's Advanced Placement Program (AP) provides motivated and academically prepared students with the opportunity to take rigorous college-level courses while still in high school, and to earn college credit, advanced placement, or both for successful performance on the AP Exams. About 18 percent of the nearly 1.7 million students who took AP Exams performed at a sufficiently high level to also earn an AP Scholar Award.

The College Board recognizes several levels of achievement based on a student's performance on AP Exams.

At Fort Bend Baptist Academy, Charles Arvin qualified for the National AP Scholar Award by earning an average grade of 4 or higher on a five-point scale on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams. A 2009 graduate, Arvin is now attending Texas A & M University.

Charles Arvin, Christopher Chen, Megan Esteb, Lee Fowler, and Jane Jarjour qualified for the AP Scholar with Distinction Award by earning an average grade of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.

Students recognized as AP Scholars with Honor include Lauren Mitchell, Michael Teague, and Zachary Wood. Additional students earning the title of AP Scholars were Benjamin Dawson, Jacob Heidenreich, Michael Mulcahy, Whitney Parker, and Kiara Skokan.
