Crystal Buraruk selected as 2009-10 National Hispanic Scholar

Crystal Buraruk, a current senior and member of the Class of 2010 at Fort Bend Baptist Academy in Sugar Land, was recently selected as a **2009-10 National Hispanic Scholar**.

The announcement was made by The College Board, and is given to approximately 5,000 students selected from a pool of over 200,000 who took the 2008 PSAT/NMSQT and identified themselves as Hispanic/Latino.

Students must have a GPA above 3.5, and also have achieved a minimum score on the PSAT. The National Hispanic Recognition Program was initiated in 1983 to identify outstanding Hispanic/Latino high school students.

Buraruk is the daughter of Tavat and Erendira Buraruk of Sugar Land. During high school she has been involved in several extra curricular activities. She is currently a member of the Eagles Academic Team, while also participating in the French Club, Drama Club, Art Club, Spanish Club, while earning recognition as a member of The National Honor Society, and Mu Alpha Theta.

She is considering several colleges and universities, including Baylor University, Texas Christian University, and Texas A & M University.
