Fort Bend Baptist Academy Raises \$4,448 for Haiti Relief Fund

In just three days, students at Fort Bend Baptist Academy were able to raise \$4,448.00 to contribute to the Haiti Relief Fund. The earthquake's destruction and the humanitarian efforts needed to assist Haitians were the topics of discussions at all grade levels from elementary to high school.

"Students deposited change and dollar bills in large water bottles during lunch over a three day period, and raised even more money than they thought possible," said Pam Jacobsen, FBBA Director of Public Relations. "Founder's Bank in Sugar Land generously provided the Cash Cow change counter to help us with the almost \$1,400 in pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters that we collected. We were able to send a total of \$4,448.00 to World Vision's Haiti Relief Fund; World Vision has about 800 workers permanently in Haiti and so could be immediately hands-on in the relief efforts."
